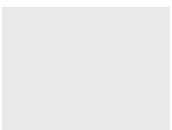

VILLAGE OF / CITY OF MARCH 20TH REFERENDUM

In 2010, the Illinois State Legislature gave municipalities a tool to help taxpayers save money. The State has given municipalities the ability to seek competitive pricing for the provision of electricity to residents and small businesses. In order to seek competitive prices for electrical services for our residents, the CITY/VILLAGE needs approval from the residents through a referendum. The **VILLAGE BOARD / CITY COUNCIL** has placed the needed referendum regarding residential and small business electrical services on the **March 20th Ballot**. The referendum asks our residents if the **VILLAGE / CITY** should have the authority to seek competitive pricing bids for electrical services under a single contract that would include residents and small businesses. It is hoped that by combining electrical service for all individual customers into a single bid, consumers will have lower electric bills and save money.

The referendum reads:

“Shall the **VILLAGE / CITY OF** have the authority to arrange for the supply of electricity for its residential and small commercial retail customers who have not opted out of such program?”

Voter approval of the referendum is the first step in the process of trying to achieve better consumer pricing for residents and small businesses. If voters approve the referendum, the **VILLAGE /CITY** would take the following next steps: (1) the **VILLAGE/CITY** would hold two public meetings, (2) it must develop a plan, (3) it must solicit competitive pricing bids, and (4) if, and only if, the bids reflect lower prices than ComEd pricing, the **VILLAGE BOARD/ CITY COUNCIL** would approve agreements that would initiate the program for residents and small businesses. If the competitive bid process does not benefit residents and small businesses through lower electric bills, then the **VILLAGE / CITY** would not enter into the agreement.

Please note, if the voters do approve the referendum residents will still have the opportunity to “opt-out” of any negotiated program the **VILLAGE/CITY** establishes. In other words, an approval vote does not require voters to make any changes in their electric service provider. If you are happy with your current service and do not want to change, you will not have to.
